1. What are some things in life that seem to never change?
2. What are some things that are always changing?

Reflection Questions

1. How does the truth that life is always changing help you think about all the chaos of 2020? What changes or losses have been the most significant for you this year?
2. Look at how David trusts in God in Psalm 11, particularly how the uncertainty of verses 2-3 move into confidence in God in v 4. What is motivating about how David does this?
3. Look at the sovereignty of God over the chaotic waters in Ps 29. How is God's power over chaos good for your heart?
4. Read Ps 131. How does this give you a sense of what it could be like for you to be confident in God's sovereignty over your life? How, practically, do you think you can grow in calmness and contentment?
5. What does it mean that we are receiving an unshakeable kingdom? (Heb 12:28) What does that mean when we feel shaken?
